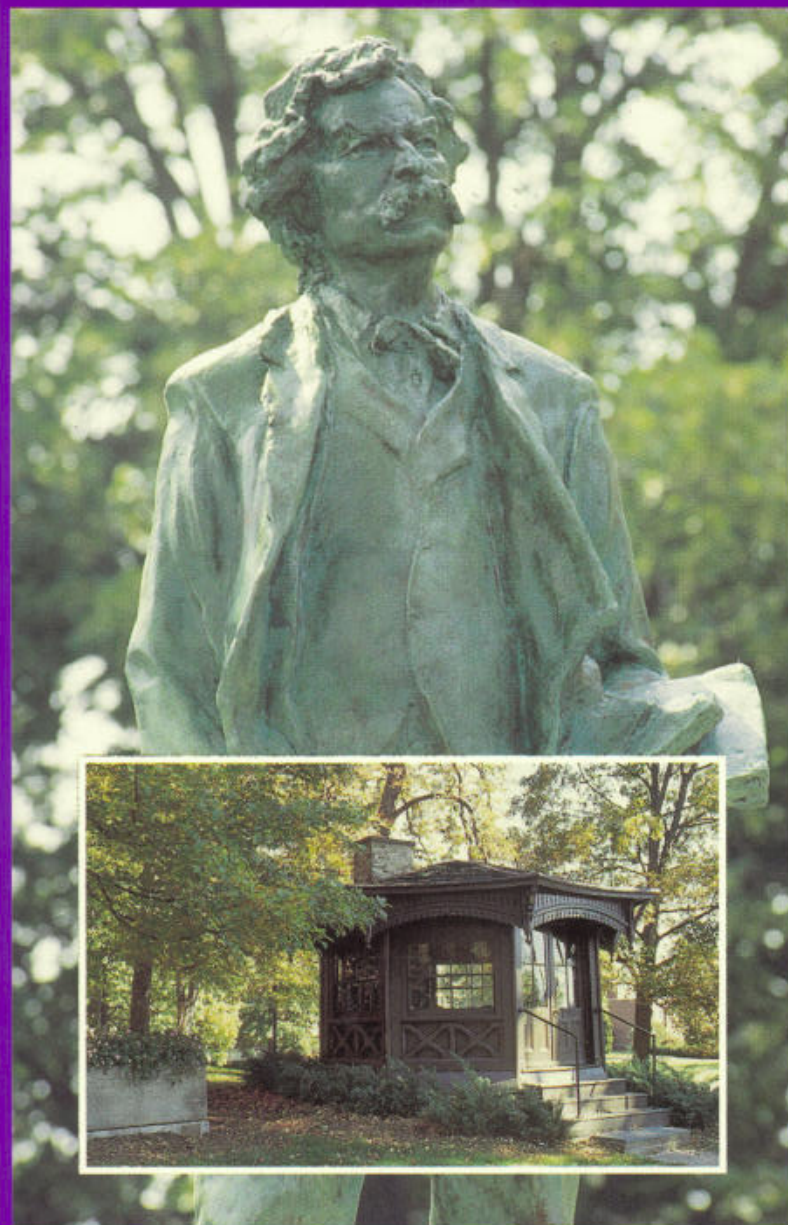

The most famous literary landmark in America, the Mark Twain Study, was moved from Quarry Farm in 1952 to what the *Philadelphia Inquirer* has called "the picture-postcard perfect campus of Elmira College."

See where Mark Twain wrote *Adventures of Huckleberry Finn* and other classics. The Mark Twain Exhibit, located in Hamilton Hall, contains photographs and memorabilia related to those many years when Mark Twain and his family summered in Elmira. The statue is a tribute to Mark Twain and notes that his wife, Olivia Langdon Clemens, was an alumna of Elmira College, in the Class of 1864.
